

# Red Drum Benchmark Stock Assessment Update

November 5, 2015

### Background



- Key objective of management is abundance/biomass stock status in addition to overfishing status
- Several limitations with the Statistical Catch-at-Age model developed for SEDAR 18
  - Plus group (7+) includes ≈90% of the ages in the northern stock and ≈83% of the ages in the southern stock
  - No reliable abundance/biomass estimates
  - Reliance on the tag-based F estimates

### **SEDAR 18 Recommendations**



 Statistical analysis of tag-recapture data, preferably within the assessment model, to inform F estimates

 Fit survey and fishery length data directly due to the sparse coverage of age sampling

 Develop catch compositions with survey- or fleetspecific age samples

# New Modeling Framework



### Stock Synthesis 3 (SS3)

Tag-recapture model that informs F estimates

- Integrated design
  - Superior for handling missing data
  - Survey- and fishery-specific age data
  - Fits to survey and fishery length composition data

# Challenges with SS3



 Stock Assessment Subcommittee encountered several issues throughout model development that contributed to unstable models

SAS sought external guidance for improving model stability

 Model instability persisted through a workshop in June, but the SAS agreed continuing work on the SS3 models was the most beneficial path for the assessment

### SEDAR 44 Review Workshop



• August 25-27, 2015

 Objective of the workshop modified given the challenges experienced by the SAS

Peer review panel provided guidance and recommendations

 Peer review panel endorsed the SAS's decision to continue development of models with SS3

# **Moving Forward**



 Recommendations currently being implemented

 The SAS expects to complete work to be reviewed by the end of 2015




# Spanish Mackerel 2015 FMP Review



# Status of the Fishery





### **Status of Stock**



- 2012 Stock Assessment
  - SEDAR Review
  - Stock is not overfished
  - Stock not experiencing overfishing

# Status Of Management



#### **Omnibus Amendment (2011)**

- Rec: 12" FL or 14" TL; 15 fish bag limit
- Com: 12" FL or 14" TL, 3500lb trip limit (decreasing for FL as quota is taken)

#### Addendum I (2013)

- Reduce min size in commercial pound net fishery to 11.5"
- Extended to 2015 and 2016 fishing seasons

# Status of Management - Federal



#### **CMP Framework Amendment 1 (2014)**

Increase ACL to 6.063 million pounds

#### **Amendment 20B (2015)**

Separates commercial quota into N/S zones

#### **CMP Framework Amendment 2 (2015)**

Decreased trip limit in SC, GA, FL (3,500; 1,500; 500)

### **State Compliance**



#### **Omnibus Amendment**

All states found in compliance

#### **De Minimis**

- 3 year average, combined com and rec, 1%
- Requests from NJ, DE, GA
- States meet requirements

#### Recommendations



#### Management


 The PRT recommends the Board approve the 2015 Spanish Mackerel FMP Review, state compliance reports, and de minimis status for NJ, DE, and GA

#### Research

- Length, sex, age, and CPUE data are needed for improved stock assessment accuracy
- Provide better estimates of recruitment, natural mortality rates, fishing mortality rates, and standing stock







#### **Status of Stock**



#### No coastwide stock assessment

- Data availability
- Life history/migration

#### 2014 VA/NC Stock Assessment

- Age structure expanded in last decade
- Decline in recruitment after 2010
- Spawning stock biomass peaked in 2007

# Status of Management



#### **Omnibus Amendment (2011)**

- 12" TL min size for rec and com fishery
- All states in compliance

#### **De Minimis**

- 3 year average, combined com and rec, 1%
- Requests: NJ and DE
- Both states qualify

### Recommendations



#### Management

 The PRT recommends the Board approve the 2015 Spotted Seatrout FMP Review, state compliance reports, and de minimis status for NJ and DE

#### Research

- Increase observer coverage in states with a commercial fishery
- Conduct state-specific stock assessments
