


North Carolina American Shad Fishery Management Plan Update



ASMFC Shad and River Herring Management Board February 2, 2023

Background



- Amendments 2 & 3 of the Shad and River
 Herring FMP require states wishing to have a
 fishery must submit a Sustainable Fishery
 Management Plan that will:
 - "demonstrate their stock could support a commercial and/or recreational fishery that will not diminish the future stock reproduction and recruitment."
- Plans are updated and reviewed every 5 years to reassess stock status and sustainability

Plan Update for Board Consideration




- January 2023: Staff from North Carolina presented an updated Shad SFMP for TC review
 - Plan would be in place from 2023 through 2027
- The TC recommends approval of the plan as presented



Request for Fisheries

This plan includes a request for approval of both recreational and commercial harvest within the state waters. North Carolina justifies this request based on analysis of historical trends in fishery-independent and fishery-dependent data for the Albemarle Sound-Roanoke River, Tar-Pamlico River, Neuse River, and Cape Fear River systems.





Stock Status

Albemarle Sound

Not overfished.

Overfishing not occurring.

Tar-Pamlico River

Unknown

Neuse River

Unknown

Adult mortality status is considered sustainable.

Cape Fear River

Unknown

Increasing trend in adult abundance since 2005.



Summary of Changes

Sustainability Parameters





- JAI new sustainability parameter.
- Albemarle Sound (IGNS) Female CPUE sink nets dropped from analysis to match new IGNS sampling method.
- Relative F FI index not constrained to commercial fishery (month and mesh size).



Tar-Pamlico and Neuse Rivers

• Relative F – added recreational harvest.



Cape Fear River

- Electrofishing Female CPUE dropped sampling site (LD-3) from analysis.
- Relative F added recreational harvest.



Summary of Changes

Commercial/Recreational Harvest



Albemarle Sound-Roanoke River

 Commercial – could be allowed anytime Jan 1 – April 14 decided by work group following review of previous seasons data, parameters, etc.



Tar-Pamlico and Neuse Rivers

 Commercial – could be allowed anytime Feb 15 – April 14 decided by work group following review of previous seasons data, parameters, etc.



Cape Fear River

 Commercial – could be allowed anytime Feb 20 – April 11 decided by work group following review of previous seasons data, parameters, etc.



All Other Internal Waters

- Commercial could be allowed anytime Feb 15 April 14 decided by work group following review of previous seasons data, parameters, etc.
- Recreational 1-fish American shad limit within 10-fish shad aggregate.








Shad & River Herring Commercial Landings 1950-2021 Source: ACCSP and ASMFC Compliance Reports

Required Passage Counts



- Counts required in ME, NH, MA, RI, CT, PA, MD, and SC
- Coastwide total passage in 2021:
 - -4.44 million river herring
 - -377,472 shad



Coastwide Stocking



 2021: shad fry stocked by RI, DE, MD/DC/PRFC, and SC

Total shad stocked in 2021: 16.24 million



Sturgeon Interactions



- 40 interactions were reported in 2021
 - NJ gill netters reported 1,666 lbs of discarded sturgeon
- Reported by CT, NJ, PRFC, VA, NC, SC, GA
- RI 2021 data not yet available
 - 4 interactions in 2020



De minimis Requests




Shad

• ME, NH, MA, FL

River herring

• NH, GA, FL

 These states meet the requirements for de minimis.



PRT Report



- Several states did not report on all monitoring requirements listed under Amendments 2 and 3.
 - Funding and staffing issues
 - COVID-19 pandemic measures
- Edisto River below American shad CPUE benchmark 2019-2021
- Format issues
 - Not all states provided a copy or link to their current fishery regulations.
 - Not all states included a section for hickory shad reporting.

 Consider approval of the 2021 Shad and River Herring FMP Review, state compliance reports, and de minimis status for Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Georgia, and Florida
