
Florida Conservation Equivalency Proposal

Overview

- Amendment 2 was implemented in January 2013
- Implementation of a quota management program
- Amendment provides flexibility for Alternative management approaches that are deemed conservation equivalent
















Background

- 1995 net ban prohibited use of gill nets in state waters
- Limited all other nets to no greater than 500 square feet of mesh area in state waters
- Effectively limited fishery to cast nets as primary gear
- Also limited cast nets to no greater than 14'















Reporting Issues

- An estimated ¾ of commercial landings have gone unreported
- However law states any commercial sale must be reported
- Unreported landings extend back prior to the net ban
- Estimated that occurrence of unreported landings has been consistent over time
- Industry has been alerted that they need to report bait landings moving forward


















Need for Conservation Equivalency

- FL fishers have already endured significant reduction
- FL harvest provides bait to other important fisheries
- Harvest has been reduced significantly through time
- Menhaden will remain sustainable because of their current gear restrictions
- Management of a quota based on inaccurate reporting will result in early closure of the fishery as reporting improves

















Request

- Florida's current gear limitation regulations are a more conservative and effective approach to management than the current strategy of decreasing mortality through the use of a quota.
- Therefore, FL is requesting to be exempt from the their quota. (FL quota =66,995 pounds)

















Supporting Data


- 1986-1994 landings averaged 2.7 million pounds
- 1996-2012 landings averaged 152,000 pounds
- 94% decrease
- Level of reporting was assumed to be constant






TC Report

- The reference period for setting the quota (2009-2011) already incorporates conservation measures cited by proposal.
- Decrease in landings since 1995 net ban may have other causes
- Other states implemented conservation measures prior the allocation period

















TC Report

- The scale of landings in FL alone are not biologically harmful, but if states with equivalent harvest to Florida file for conservation equivalency the impact could compound significantly
- It is difficult to fully evaluate conservation equivalency without knowing the species differentiations of landings in FL
- If FL does not have a quota there is the potential for other states to land menhaden in FL.


Compliance Criteria for 2013 Fishing Year

Directed Fishery

- Report commercial landings by year and major gear type
- Include official dated closure notice for directed commercial fisheries
- Indicate if your state participated in a quota transfer
- NOTE: Please send this information as soon as possible, preferably by February 15.
















Bycatch Fishery

- Report bycatch landings in the most detail possible (trip level information including gear type.
- Reminder all bycatch landings that occur prior to the closure of directed fisheries count towards the quota
- Provide an analysis of trips harvesting under the bycatch allowance by gear type to analyze the effectiveness of a 6,000 pound bycatch allowance
- NOTE: Please send this information as soon as possible, preferably by February 15.















Bycatch Fishery

 Reminder that in 2014 all states will be limited to a 6,000 pound per vessel per trip bycatch limit regardless of the number of permit holders on the vessel with only one landing event per calendar day
















Episodic Event Set Aside

 If your state participated in the set aside, report landings in the most detail possible (trip level information including gear type)















Mandatory Monitoring Programs

 Summarize reporting programs (e.g., frequency, harvester reporting, dealer reporting, data elements reported)

 Purse seine and bait seine vessels (or snapper rigs) must be required to submit trip level reports















Mandatory Monitoring Programs

- Age and length data from the commercial bait harvest.
 - One 10-fish sample (age and length) per 300 MT for bait forME, NH, MA, RI, CT, NY, NJ, DE
 - One 10-fish sample (age and length) per 200 MT for bait for MD, PRFC, VA, NC















Mandatory Monitoring Programs

- Indicate that the following mandatory catch and effort data elements are being collected for the pound net fishery
 - Total pounds landed per day
 - Number of pound nets fished per day











Stock Assessment Progress Report

- ➤ Benchmark assessment scheduled for 2014 (SEDAR)
- > 10 meetings so far (6 webinars; 4 in-person):
 - Developed TORs
 - Identified and completed preliminary workups of new data sources
 - Held Data Workshop



Stock Assessment Progress Report

- Jan 14-16th Data Workshop
 - Vetted all available data sources
 - Fishery dependent: landings & CPUE
 - Fishery independent: 27 surveys
 - Life history: growth, maturity, fecundity, M
 - Historical tagging project: inform M & migration
 - Developed plan for new models/configurations
 - Assigned tasks for June Assessment Workshop



Stock Assessment Progress Report

- Next steps:
 - -2014
 - April 1 Tentative deadline for finalizing data/model inputs
 - May 1 Tentative deadline for public submissions of alternative models/analyses
 - June Assessment Workshop in Beaufort, NC
 - December peer review workshop (SEDAR)
 - -2015
 - February Assessment results presented to Board



Stock Assessment Progress Report: BERP WG

- Met Dec 10-11, 2013 to finalize MSVPA update in preparation for menhaden benchmark. Kinks in model being ironed out this month.
- Will meet again in spring 2014 to finalize work on AM benchmark TOR #7:
 - Identify potential ecological reference points that account for Atlantic menhaden's role as a forage fish.
 - Provide proposed methodology, a model development plan, and example results using preliminary model configurations, if time allows.
